
TÉNÉRÉ is a Tamashek/Berber word meaning empty land or desert. The plural of the word is Tinariwen.

The Short Story version of 'Before the Rains Came' long listed by Short Story Day Africa for the "Disruption" edition.




































### **GLOSSARY**

#### LEKKI TOLL GATE MASSACRE, NIGERIA

On the night of 20 October 2020, at about 6:50 p.m, members of the Nigerian Army opened fire on peaceful End SARS protesters at the Lekki toll gate in Lagos State, Nigeria. Amnesty International stated that at least 12 protesters were killed during the shooting. There were complaints of missing persons and a few were confirmed hospitalized and in critical condition. A day after the incident, on the 21 October, the governor of Lagos State, Babajide Sanwo-olu, initially denied reports of any loss of lives, but later admitted in an interview with CNN that two persons were killed. The Nigerian Army whose officers were the principal actors in the shooting initially denied that the shooting ever happened and that none of its officers were ever at the toll gate, that the video footages of its officers shooting into the crowd were 'photoshopped'. A week later, however, the Nigerian Army admitted that it had deployed soldiers to the toll gate on the orders of the governor of Lagos State. The governor tweeted the next day that "It is imperative to explain that no governor controls the rules of engagement of the army." His tweet was taken to mean that he had not made any such orders.

Meanwhile President Buhari in his address to the nation two days after the incident after much worldwide pressure did not acknowledge the massacre at all and doubled down on a veiled threat to violently quell peaceful protests. The below tweet satirically summarizes the energy of the President's non-reaction: "President came out like: I have been receiving calls from the outside that something is happening in our country, I am not aware. Please those of you outside mind your business. now those of you inside, if I hear pim again, uno go hear am.. #EndSARS" ~@Omoba

#### DJ SWITCH

Nigerian disc jockey DJ Switch, made a livestream video of the shooting on her Instagram account. Though many other eyewitness videos & footages surfaced in the aftermath of the shooting, her livestream was a catalytic action in real time that would prove as invaluable proof of the shooting. The video catapulted her to nationwide fame. In a video she made on the 23 of October, she clarified that she witnessed the shooting of seven people at the time she was doing the live Instagram video. She said that armed soldiers and police officers shot at her and other peaceful #EndSARS protesters at the Lekki toll gate on the night of 20 October. Among them were officers of the disbanded SARS. She reported that at least 15 people were killed and that soldiers carried the dead bodies away in the cover of night. She has since left the country for Canada following numerous threats to her life.

#### THE FEMINIST COALITION

The feminist coalition is a group of young Nigerian feminists formed in July 2020 with a mission to champion equality for women in Nigerian society with a core focus on education, financial freedom and representation in public office. They have a vision for a Nigeria where equality for all people is a reality in our laws and everyday lives. The Feminist Coalition were very instrumental in the #EndSars protests in raising funds and providing medical aid, legal aid, relief for victims of police brutality and families of the deceased, organizing a memorial for the Fallen and mental health support.
